Mission of The Women Of Grace Widows' Fund (WOGWF)

The mission of the Women Of Grace Widows' Fund is to enact and make real an ongoing structure to alleviate the extreme poverty faced by widows in Malawi by providing funding to meet basic food, shelter, and safety needs, while creating opportunities and resources that enable and empower widows to establish their own self-sufficiency and independence, regardless of religious affiliation.

Connecting, Sharing and Changing Lives

Our mission work in Malawi assisting women continues thanks to the **ongoing and generous support** of our donors and the work of **Sam Chirwa** and **Grace Chiumia** in Malawi. In March of 2015, a group composed of **Heather White** (WOGWF Board member), **Margot McGorman** and **Mike Miller**, all members of the Watertown First Presbyterian Church Outreach Council, traveled to Malawi on a fact-finding trip. Updates on each project were shared upon their return.

Michenguatuwa - Many of the widows in this group are elderly and unable to work. WOGWF meets **acute needs** such as transportation to medical appointments, housing and food.

Mbowe - Formed four years ago, these women are the youngest and most capable women in the WOGWF program. They participate in a "Village Loan" model to raise pigs for sale at market. Part of their profits are used to purchase supplies for the pigs with WOGWF providing the balance of support. The aim is to have this group self-sufficient within four years. WOGWF also recently built a new home in Mbowe.

Mzenga - Also using a Village Loan model, 18 women are working together to raise fish in a man-made pond which are then harvested four times a year The team also visited a bee farm that has

been initiated by 5 women with bee frames constructed and plans for this project to be self-sustaining within five years. This group of widows spans all ages with the elderly working with the young to the best of their ability.

Clint McCoy Feeding Center - The center continues to provide 80 children a hot meal two days a week. The children also enjoy songs and lesson time with a WOGWF volunteer. During the March visit, each child received a new pair of shoes and each family was given soap and lotion.

Keys To Education - The team was able to meet with government officials, teacher representatives from the Keys to Education program and Professor Gift Dube, director of the Children's Library Program at nearby Mzuzu University. All involved confirmed the need for culturally appropriate early literacy materials and training. Heather White was invited to return and teach an Early Literacy class at Mzuzu University. Plans are underway for this and for the future of the Keys to Education program. The three-year grant funding from the PW Thank Offering has concluded. Funding options along with the best way to maintain the strength of this program are being explored by WOGWF.

The trip made clear that our efforts over the years have resulted in **many lives being touched and changed** and the future is promising for more success.

2016 Sewing Trip

A two-week trip in the summer of 2016 is being planned to provide sewing training to the women in Mbowe. Margot McGorman of Watertown and Ellen Grayson of Canton, both accomplished seamstresses, will train women (who in turn will train others) on treadle sewing machines to reinforce basic sewing abilities and teach advanced skills which can be used to produce clothing for their families and items suitable to be sold at the market.

Plans include the buying 4 to 6 treadle sewing machines along with sewing supplies and fabric in Malawi. The machines will be set up in the Mbowe Community Building where the training will take place.

Margot and Ellen will train 4 to 6 women who show aptitude and interest in sewing by cutting patterns and sewing simple projects to continually build skills and confidence. They also will instruct 2 to 3 women in business fundamentals to ensure that a percentage of the profits from the sale of these hand-sewn items at the market will be set aside to purchase additional supplies and fabric for a successful and sustainable sewing business.

During the trip, they also will work with all the widows in Mbowe to share **simple sewing repairs** that can be done by hand to extend the life of their clothing.

To accomplish their goals, they will conduct the trainings in English and Chichewa (the local native language) and provide written materials in both languages with a heavy emphasis on diagrams for machine threading, tension adjustment and pattern instruction.

Total costs for the trip are approximately \$7,000 (based on recent mission trip expenses). This includes sewing machines, fabric, notions and equipment, travel, food and lodging, and translation service. Seed money of \$1,000 has been donated by the Presbyterian Women of Northern New York. Fundraising efforts are currently underway for the balance. 
